The next day the great crowd that had come to the festival heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord— the King of Israel!" Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it; as it is written: "Do not be afraid, daughter of Zion. Look, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written of him and had been done to him.

The crowds were fickle – today cheering and celebrating and all too soon this turned to anger and they were calling for Jesus' punishment. We are only human, and we are at times filled with the reality and joy of God's presence, only to bewail his silence in the next moment.

This time of being away from the world does not mean being away from God. Why not spend some time in His company? Sit still and read some of your bible. (If you need one let Vanda know and she can drop one off for you – she has loads!) Start with one of the gospels and see where you go from here.

Take a piece of green ribbon or a leaf, this can be a reminder to you to pray, lay before God your worries and your thanksgiving, the people and the world just as the people on Palm Sunday laid their palm leaves and coats before Jesus.

Three Following the Lord's Footsteps

John 13:3-5 Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, and that He had come forth from God and was going back to God, got up from supper, and laid aside His garments; and taking a towel, He girded Himself. 

Circle us, Lord


